SECOND MONITORING REPORT

Period: September 2013 – March 2014

I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1.1 Pursuant to paragraph 52 of the current policy of the Independent Consultation and Investigation Mechanism (ICIM) (document GN-1830-49), this report is issued to report the progress made over the period of reference (September 2013 through March 2014) on the commitments assumed by the Parties under the Memorandum of Understanding and Commitment ("Memorandum" or "Agreement") signed in December 2012 in Case AR-MICI001-2010, regarding the Multiphase Program for the Development of Production Support Infrastructure in Entre Ríos (document AR-L1036). The progress related in this report builds on the advances made during the period from January through August 2013, which are documented in the first monitoring report.¹
- 1.2 According to information furnished to the ICIM by the Parties² during the present reporting period, progress has been made: (i) on the design of the Citizen Participation Plan; and (ii) on works to supply residents with three-phase power. However, there has been no headway on other activities envisaged under the Agreement, as they depend on progress made in the project—which has begun and is currently in the construction phase—and on the Citizen Participation Committee's approval and implementation of the Citizen Participation Plan.
- 1.3 To date, 10 of the 22 activities included in the Agreement³ have either been fulfilled or are in the process of being fulfilled. Over the next six months, the approval and implementation of the Citizen Participation Plan will be closely monitored, and, once work on the transformer station commences, the Consultation Phase team plans to visit the project site to help the Parties draft a compliance timetable and verify that conditions are in place for its implementation.

II. ICIM POLICY FOUNDATIONS FOR AGREEMENT MONITORING

Paragraph 52 of the ICIM policy⁴ establishes the following agreement monitoring obligations in the Consultation Phase: "The Project Ombudsperson⁵ is responsible for making arrangements to provide for: (a) direct or outside monitoring of any agreement reached by the parties to the

consultation; and (b) adequate measures to determine whether such agreement is being implemented in an appropriate manner. The Project Ombudsperson shall consult with the Requester with respect to the monitoring measures. Monitoring reports shall be issued at least semi-annually for so long as the Project Ombudsperson deems appropriate. Monitoring protocols and reports shall be made public via the Registry. The Project Ombudsperson will notify the President, Board (and the Donors Committee, in the case of a MIF-funded operation), the Requester, and other relevant parties of the results of its periodic monitoring exercises and of any recommendations that may result therefrom."

III. CASE BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The case originated with a request initially submitted to the ICIM on 28 June 2010 by Pablo and Matías Folonier and Sara Ramona Quiroga, and later joined by several residents of the El Brete neighborhood (collectively "the Requesters"), alleging potential environmental and social impacts stemming from the "Multiphase Program for the Development of Production Support Infrastructure in Entre Ríos," AR-L1036 ("the Project"), financed by the IDB in Argentina, in violation of Operational Policy OP-703 (Environment and Safeguards Compliance) and Operational Policy OP-102 (Access to Information).
- 3.2 From March 2011 through December 2012, the Parties—the Requesters, Energía de Entre Ríos S.A. (ENERSA), and the Program Execution Coordination Unit (PCU) of the Ministry of the Economy, Treasury, and Finance of Entre Ríos—voluntarily engaged in a dialogue process facilitated by the ICIM on the following issues: (i) technology and design options for the transformer station that would represent a significant or appreciable change in terms of visual and/or environmental impacts; and (ii) visual impact mitigation measures, implementation of conservation activities, and promotion of specific arrangements with the relevant public agencies. On 18 December 2012, this process culminated in the signing of an agreement between the Parties.⁶
- 3.3 The Agreement included the following commitments, made in good faith and by consensus: (i) to increase measures for mitigating visual impact; (ii) to improve infrastructure conditions in the El Brete neighborhood; (iii) to create a private natural protected area; (iv) to implement a Citizen Participation Plan; (v) to resolve disputes through dialogue and mediation, and to withdraw lawsuits; and (vi) to make any statements to the media jointly with regard to the case or the Agreement.
- 3.4 The Parties agreed that the monitoring of commitments would be carried out by the ICIM.
- 3.5 The first monitoring report on the case⁷ was published on 30 August 2013, covering the period from January through August 2013.

IV. ACTION UNDERTAKEN DURING THE MONITORING PROCESS

- 4.1 Pursuant to information furnished to the ICIM by the Requesters and ENERSA by telephone or in writing, the following actions were carried out during the period from September 2013 through February 2014:
- 4.2 Following several meetings between ENERSA representatives and residents, an agreement was reached in January 2014 on hiring a citizen participation expert. The specialist began work on 1 February 2014 and by the end of the month had delivered a draft Citizen Participation Plan, which is currently being reviewed by Pablo Folonier and ENERSA specialists.
- 4.3 Regarding the provision of three-phase power, ENERSA completed the agreed infrastructure works and is in a position to provide three-phase power to residents who request it, once they have equipped their homes with the necessary connections. To date, this service has been provided to the only resident who both requested the service and complied with the agreed requirements.
- 4.4 ENERSA reported that since construction began on the transformer station, the original construction schedule had to be adjusted by four to six months, owing to force majeure—a delay approved by the IDB. The will result in an equivalent delay in the activities to be carried out under the Agreement.
- 4.5 Other commitments depend on the work of the Citizen Participation Committee, which will be formed in accordance with the Citizen Participation Plan prepared by the contracted expert hired for that purpose, once the Parties have reviewed and approved it.
- 4.6 As of the publication date of this report, the following points of the Agreement had either been fulfilled or were in the process of being fulfilled:⁸

V. NEXT STEPS AND CONCLUSION

- 5.1 The Parties reported on complications regarding the availability of all involved stakeholders, including time-related constraints, resulting in slower implementation of the commitments. Nevertheless, the Parties remain committed to the process, which continues to move forward. The Parties specifically commented on the cordial state of relations and collaboration during the process.
- 5.2 Pursuant to the Agreement and actions undertaken to date, the ICIM will monitor the following activities between April and September 2014:
 - a. Citizen Participation Plan:
 - i. Results of the Parties' consideration of the plan, with a view to its approval;
 - ii. Formation of the Citizen Participation Committee;
 - iii. Initiation of the plan's implementation; and
 - iv. Supervision of the hired consultant.
 - b. Measures to mitigate visual impact:
 - i. Preparation of a timetable of commitments to carry out agreed activities in this area; and

- ii. Preparation of a photo documentation project to facilitate the monitoring of progress and to assess the situation before and after.
- 5.3 As part of the ICIM monitoring function, the Consultation Phase team is expected to conduct a monitoring mission to the project site between June and July 2014. The date of that mission is subject to progress in the transformer station construction works.
