□ F	Format: Submit your complaint in writing via <u>email</u> or postal mail. There is no specific
f	format required. Complaints may be written in any language.
	Complainant details: Your complaint should include the name of each person or
C	organization filing the complaint, as well as contact details for key community
	representatives. If you have a representative, include signed written authorization
•	oroviding authority for the representative to represent you.
	Project details: Provide the name and location of the DFC-supported project, along
	with any additional details (e.g. sector, company name, or project name). You can find
	nformation about projects on the <u>DFC Project Page</u> , via a <u>Freedom of Information Act</u>
	(FOIA) request, or through the DeBIT tool (a database you can search).
	Description of harm: Explain the harm you are experiencing or fear, supported by
	facts and evidence.
	Confidentiality: Indicate if you require confidentiality due to fear of reprisals or for
C	other reasons.

	Any efforts you have made to resolve the issues with the DFC or its client (or if you
ł	naven't made those efforts, why not).
	Choice of function: Indicate whether you prefer dispute resolution (known as

F	Policies and Procedures.
	Your preferred outcomes or remedy.
	Additional supporting material: maps, photos, media reports, copies of
